All tickets are \$6.

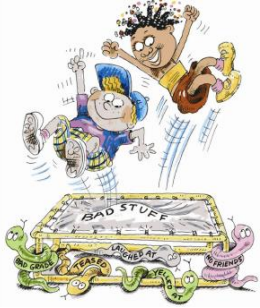

Zac and Renee from Area F

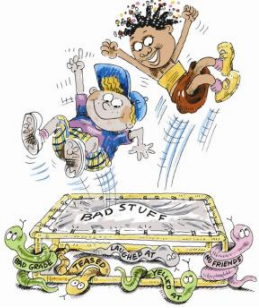
